

PARAGON ERRATA

As we develop our games, we try our best to ensure quality, but inevitably things slip through the cracks. This errata will be updated, as necessary, as any tweaks or changes are found. Simple typographical or layout issues are not indicated here, but any rules changes or clarifications are. All PDF versions of our books will contain all the latest errata, as given in each revision listed below. On-demand print books will also be updated with the latest errata.

- p. 61: **Exchanging Skills:** There's a pretty nasty exploit surrounding cannibalizing language skills. So, replace the last sentence of the first paragraph with the following:
A skill cannot be reduced to a rating less than 1 in this manner, and languages can only be cannibalized for other languages.
- p. 126: **Shotguns** were way too complicated! Now they are treated just like any other firearm firing multiple shots. Change the Shotgun entry to read:

Shotguns

Shotguns are a common long gun designed to fire shot, or a cluster of pellets, rather than a single bullet, usually via a smooth-bore (non-rifled) barrel. A shotgun slug works like any other firearm ammo. Shot, however, spreads out as it leaves the barrel. This spread is not as pronounced as video games would have us believe, but still provides a bonus to hit the target.

In practice, a shotgun is treated as any other firearm firing multiple shots at a single target: the number of pellets that hit the target is equal to the amount by which the attack roll succeeds. Shotguns firing shot suffer no to-hit penalty for range. Instead, the further the target, the more the shot spreads.

Shotgun ER entries include a parenthesized number, which is the rate of shot spread. Every such increment decreases the number of pellets that hit the target by 1.

For example, Jason fires a double-barreled shotgun using 12-ga. shot against a target with a Passive Dodge of 10 at a range of 12m. Its rate of spread is 4 meaning at 12m the number of pellets (usually 9 in a 12-ga. shell) is reduced by 3. Jason rolls a 17, meaning he hits by 7. Normally, this would mean 7 pellets hit the target. But since he's at -3 pellets, only 4 hit.

Shotgun ammunition is measured by gauge (-ga.), and smaller gauges are bigger bullets. All shotguns listed have stocks, except for the sawed-

off variety.

- p. 138: **Exploding Dice:** Add the following paragraph: *Any given roll can't be made more times than its HDL. So HDL 2 can be rolled a maximum of twice, even if the second roll would explode.*
- p. 138: **Botches:** They were too easy to avoid! Change the third paragraph to read:
Any time dice are rolled, if the minimum is rolled (1 on all applicable dice), the player must make a Luck check at the same DIF as that of the initial roll attempt. If this check fails, then the character botches. For instance, if the initial check has a DIF of 12 and your skill roll is a potential botch, you must roll a Luck check, DIF 12.
- p. 204: **Destination:** Change text to read: By casting this spell, you know the quickest route to take to reach a known destination. The destination must be a specific place, not a creature or object; you don't need personal familiarity with it, though you need to know of its existence. During the spell's duration, it imparts to you any steps you must take in order to get to your destination when necessary, such as avoiding traps or speaking command words.
- p. 239: **See Life:**
Enhancer: An animal eye and a drop of blood.
- p. 248: **Time Door:** Remove last sentence.
- p. 249: **Time Window:** Last sentence of first paragraph should read:
The window gives you sound as well as images, and has a diameter of up to (Saturn) meters.
